DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Teach, guide and supervise day campers of all abilities, ages 3-13.
2. Provide an example of a model counselor on a consistent basis.
3. Help all to be included and feel accepted by encouraging participation of all.
4. Help Senior Educators to provide quality environmental science programs.
5. Communicate consistently with supervisors about group life and camper situations.
6. Ensure health and safety of camp participants and staff.
7. Be versed in and demonstrate KNC's customer standards at all times.
8. Be willing to work with others in a supportive, friendly manner.
9. Maintain flexible work schedule, which may include overnight camp-outs and bus route supervision.
10. Other duties as assigned by supervisors.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Must be able to supervise children 40 hours a week with some overnight duties. Must be able to negotiate hilly terrain, rustic trails, and walk several miles per day. Must possess the stamina to carry out camp programs in hot and humid Michigan climate over an extended period of time. Must possess visual and auditory abilities to identify and respond to environmental and other hazards related to camp activity.

Must have a commitment to uphold a strong work and environmental ethic while respecting the diversity of culture and beliefs in our campers and fellow staff. Must possess the ability to communicate and work with groups of all ages and skill levels in order to provide necessary instruction to campers. Must be able to observe camper behavior, evaluate its appropriateness, and enforce and implement appropriate behavior management techniques.

Applicant must be 15 years of age or older. Preference will be given to those with an interest in environmentally related fields such as biology, ecology, environmental education or general education; and have experience working with children. Applicant must be able to commit to at least 4 weeks of the camp schedule. Camping and canoeing skills are helpful.

EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS & COMPENSATION

Paid staff training: June 14-15. Camp sessions: June 18 through August 17. Some evenings/overnight duties may be required. There will be no camp July 4-8 in observance of Independence Day. Base stipend is \$120 per week for first year staff. Staff receives a 20% discount in the Expedition Shop. Uniforms are provided.

Application deadline is March 16, 2012

Interviews will be scheduled one day April 2-6, 9am-5pm at the Kalamazoo Nature Center.
